Notice of Race



1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the ISSA Procedural Rules (including MASSA), this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2 The J22 class rules shall not apply.
- 1.3 RRS 63.7 is replaced with "If there is any conflict between the Sailing Instructions and the Notice of Race, the Sailing Instructions shall apply."

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 Competing schools must be members of MASSA.
- 2.2 Teams must be accompanied by a designated adult team leader, who may be an advisor, coach or parent recognized by the school.
- 2.3 Eligible schools must enter before Wednesday, November 13th
- 2.4 The AYC Waiver of Liability (last page of NOR) must be printed, scanned, signed (one per sailor) and emailed to avcjrsailing@gmail.com to complete the registration process.
- 2.5 Teams shall be comprised of crew of four (4). The maximum weight for each team shall be 600 pounds. Teams will be weighed in at regatta check-in. No substitutions will be allowed during the regatta.
- 2.6 This regatta will serve as the MASSA qualifier for the High School Keelboat Regatta ISSA Invitational Regatta in ST. Petersburg, Florida the weekend of December 7 and 8, 2019.

3 ENTRY FEE

3.1 There will be no entry fee.

4 DAMAGE DEPOSIT

4.1 All teams will be required to provide an \$500 damage deposit prior to the start of racing by providing a check, credit card information or AYC member number at registration. The deposit is a per incident maximum. If a team has more than one incident, he or she is then liable for up to \$500 for each individual incident. Teams should be aware that while the AYC Staff will attempt to identify all damage at the post-regatta inspection, often this is not possible due to the nature of the damage. The team is responsible for all damage, even if it is discovered only after the post-regatta inspection. In the event that there is material

damage not covered by insurance and no one acknowledges responsibility, the cost of repairs will be charged to all the designated skippers on a prorated basis.

5 BOATS

- 5.1 Eight (8) J22s will be provided by AYC. No additional boats will be available.
- 5.2 There will be a rotation of boats after each race.
- 5.3 AYC boats are equalized and no equipment, settings, or sails should be adjusted by sailors at any time before, during, or after the regatta.
- 5.4 If contact occurs between boats, damage will be assessed and assigned to a skipper according to the RRS

6 SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

First Warning (approximate)

As soon as possible after Competitors' meeting

No start sequences to begin after 1700

Awards Immediately following all boats being stored

Sunday (if no racing is possible on Saturday)

Report time 0800

First Warning (approximate)

As soon as possible after competitors meeting

No start sequences to begin after 1030

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

7.1 Sailing instructions will be made available at check-in on 11/16.

8 RACING AREA

8.1 The racing area shall be roughly between Greenbury Pt and Tolly Pt.

9 COURSES

9.1 W4 will be preferred. W3 and W5 will be options, and will be hailed verbally by the race committee.

10 SCORING

10.1 Scoring will be in accordance with ISSA PR 9. Scores will be posted on TechScore at scores.hssailing.org

11 SAFETY

- 11.1 Competitors shall wear USCG approved Type III Personal Flotation Devices (PFDs). Inflatable type PFDs are not permitted.
- 11.2 The race committee may require the use of dry suits or full-length wetsuits. This may be announced at the daily competitors' meeting, and need not be signaled.
- 11.3 Failure to comply with 11.1 and/or 11.2 will be grounds for disqualification from all races sailed in contravention of those instructions.

- 11.4 Competitors shall supply the equipment to meet the requirements of 11.1 and 11.2.
- 11.5 At its discretion, the Race Committee may require a competitor to retire from racing if the competitor is determined to be a risk to their own or others' safety.

12 COACHING

- 12.1 Will be in accordance with ISSA PR 8.
- 12.2 Coaches will be provided with RIBs to watch racing. There may be more than one coach per boat.
- 12.3 Competitors may receive coaching, including instruction, assistance, equipment, or sustenance, only between races.
- 12.4 Except in an emergency, coaches cannot communicate with their teams by VHF or cell phone.

13 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

13.1 Boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

14 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 14.1 The race committee intends to make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The specific channel will be stated in the sailing instructions.
- 14.2 Competitors must provide their own handheld VHF to carry aboard if they intend to listen to courtesy broadcasts.

15 PRIZES

15.1 Prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.

16 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

16.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.
