- c. The <u>CGA Liability Waiver</u> is attached. A proper and LEGIBLE signed waiver Must be filled out by every sailor (whether starting or a potential substitute), collected by the team coach/advisor prior to arrival and handed to me by the competitors meeting. This is non-negotiable, no waiver no sail! If an individual is found in violation of this, the team will be removed from the regatta.
- d. I will post Sailing Instructions and Course Diagram on tech score.
- e. Boats: 2015 Laser Performance Z420's will be provided for all competitors.
- f. Format: The regatta will be sailed in two divisions in a single round robin format with one division on the water at a time.
- g. Racing Area: All races will be sailed on the Thames River in close proximity to the Jacobs Rock Sailing and Seamanship Center.
- h. Coaching: Coaching will be done from shore at the Jacobs Rock Sailing and Seamanship Center. Equal access to coaching will be provided for all teams when time allows between races.
- i. Judging: CGA will not be providing Judges. I will ask for coaches to assist in expediting any protests and/or breakdowns.
- j. Water Bottles: Disposable (single use) water bottles are not allowed. Competitors shall bring their own reusable water bottles and large quantity containers for refilling. Note that the running water at Jacobs Rock is non-potable.
- k. All participants must have a valid ID to present upon entering the Academy.
- Parking: Vehicles may be parked on Eagle Drive along the waterfront with any overflow in the parking lot around Pine Hall. (Reference the Campus Map)
