2019 GOLDEN BEAR REGATTA

February 23-24, 2019

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

VENUE: Treasure Island Sailing Center – Clipper Cove
ORGANIZING AUTHORITY: Pacific Coast Interscholastic Sailing Association

HOST: Treasure Island Sailing Center

1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined by *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the ISSA Procedural Rules (as modified by PCISA), the rules of the CFJ Class (except as any of these are altered by the Sailing Instructions, or the ISSA Procedural Rules), the Notice of Race, and by these Sailing Instructions.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices will be posted on the official regatta notice board located at the Treasure Island Sailing Center (TISC) or made orally to all competitors on the water.

3. CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 1000 on the day it will take effect, except that any change in the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 on the day before it will take effect.

4. ROTATION

- 4.1 Boats will be rotated between races. The rotation schedule will be posted on TechScore.
- 4.2 Rotations will be made on the TISC floating docks unless otherwise specified at the competitors' meeting, or on the water.

5. BOATS & SAILS

- 5.1 All boats need to be inspected by a designated regatta representative before launching or racing. All teams will be responsible for rigging and unrigging the boat that they sail in the first rotation of the regatta each evening and morning. In most cases this will be the boat that was brought, borrowed or chartered for the regatta. Failure to properly care for boats and/or sails may subject a team to protest under this SI.
- 5.2 Each team will be issued a set of PCISA sails and jib sheets. Teams will be responsible for their originally issued set of sails and jib sheets and for returning those items at the end of racing on Sunday. Final race results will not be posted until all sets of sails have been returned. Sails should be clean, dry (if possible), and rolled carefully on a clean surface (not on blacktop), and placed in their bags (unless otherwise instructed). Sails MUST BE STORED INSIDE the boat they are assigned to during the night on Saturday unless specific other instructions are given by the Race Committee.

6. **COMPETITORS' MEETINGS**

MANDATORY Competitors' meetings will be held on Saturday, February 23 at 10:00am and on Sunday, February 24 at 9:30am.

8. RACING AREA

The Racing Area will be in Clipper Cove, with rotations made from the TISC floating dock only, unless otherwise specified by the RC. Coaches and spectators can view the racing from the parking lot just west of TISC. No persons shall go onto the rocks between the parking lot and the water at any time for any reason whatsoever. (This is not a protestable offense, although disciplinary action by the PCISA Board may result, at their discretion.)

9. THE COURSE

- 9.1 Diagrams in Attachment A show the courses, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 9.2 The number of the course to be sailed will be hailed and/or displayed from the Race Committee boat.

10. MARKS

Marks of the course will be as follows:

Starting pin (If not a boat – See SI 11.2): Yellow Cone
Windward/Leeward Marks or Gate: Red Cones
Windward Offset Mark: Small White Ball
Finish Pin: Small Orange Ball

11. START/FINISH

- 11.1 Races will be started in accordance with RRS Rule Appendix U.
- 11.2 The start line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee signal boat and a yellow mark, or a staff displaying an orange flag in/on a 2nd Race Committee boat. The finish line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Race Committee boat and an orange buoy for the windward finish, or the same line as the starting line for the leeward finish. The start and finish lines will be sighted from the course side of all marks.
- 11.3 No Warning Signal for a race will be given after 15:30 on Sunday, February 24, 2019.

12. INDIVIDUAL RECALL

Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules. The Race Committee will attempt to hail a boat's sail number; however, it is the responsibility of each boat to make a proper start. Failure to be hailed or hear a hail is, in itself, insufficient cause for granting redress. Code Flag 'X' shall be used to signal any individual recalls.

13. GENERAL RECALLS

A General Recall will be signaled by multiple sound signals. In accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules the "Round-the-Ends" provisions of RRS 30.1 shall then apply to all subsequent starting sequences for that race, without the need for any signal to be given (ISSA PR 7.8 (b)). The three-minute starting sequence signal will begin soon after.

14. RETIREMENT

A boat that retires from a race shall notify a Race Committee boat before leaving the race area. If that is impossible, then immediately after arriving ashore, the competitor shall notify a regatta representative.

15. ALTERNATIVE PENALTIES

RRS 44.1 and 44.2 are in effect.

16. PROTESTS

Protests must be filed in writing within 20 minutes after the last boat reaches the dock for each rotation.

17. SCORING

Scoring will be in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rule 9.

18. BREAKDOWNS

Breakdowns will be in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rule 9(e) and Appendix 3.

19. COACHING

- 19.1 All coaching, crew rotation, exchange of clothing/food/drink and communication shall only occur on docks at the TI Sailing Center. Coaches are not allowed on the water.
- 19.2 Spectator boats are discouraged, given the confined racing area and excellent land-based viewing. Any spectator boats must be anchored at least 100 feet outside the perimeter of the

race course to avoid creating wake, and spectators shall have no contact with any competitor except when rendering assistance under RRS Rule 1.1, or as instructed by the Race Committee.

20. PARTICIPATION

- 20.1 With the exception of RRS Rule 4, each school shall compete in all scheduled races. Any school breaking this rule, without permission of the Race Committee, is subject to severe disciplinary actions by the PCISA.
- 20.2 Unless competing or serving on or for the Race Committee, no competitor shall be on the water.

21. TROPHIES

Trophies will be awarded to teams placing 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in each fleet.


22. LUNCH
