SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES:

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the [ISSA Procedural Rules](#), and [the Scholastic Dinghy Class Rules](#), the MASSA Supplemental Rules, the MASSA Code of Conduct, the NOR, and these Sailing Instructions. In the event of a conflict between the governing documents and the Sailing Instructions, the latter shall take precedence.
- 1.2 . The Organizing Authority (OA) is the MidAtlantic Scholastic Sailing Association in conjunction with the hosts, Annapolis Yacht Club and Severn Sailing Association.
- 1.3. Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42, as modified by ISSA Procedural Rule 14(c) will be in effect.

2. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS:

- 2.1. Official notices will be posted on the official notice board located on Tech Score.
- 2.2. Changes to the sailing instructions shall be approved by the Regatta Chair, PRO and the MASSA Representative and posted no later than one half hour prior to the first warning signal on the day it will take effect.

3. CODE OF CONDUCT:

- 3.1 Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials. Please read & acknowledge our MASSA Code of Conduct posted on the TechScore Notice Board.

4. SCHEDULE:

- 4.1. Report times each day are listed in the NOR.
- 4.2. The number of races each day will be at the discretion of the regatta chair.
- 4.3. Rotation schedules and boat assignments will be posted on Tech Score.

5. COURSES AND MARKS:

- 5.1. Courses will be in accordance with ISSA PR 7.8
- 5.2. The race committee may designate course selection orally.
- 5.3. The pin will be Yellow Stick Buoy . All other marks will be Orange faded Marks.

6. START/FINISH AND SIGNALS:

- 6.1. Races will start in accordance with ISSA PR 7.9.
- 6.2. The start line will be between an Orange Flag on the race committee boat and a yellow stick buoy/finish line will be between an orange flag on the race committee boat and a red stick buoy to the right of the signal boat looking upwind.

7. BREAKDOWNS:

- 7.1. Breakdown requests shall be filed in the same manner as protests.
- 7.2. Breakdowns shall be scored in accordance with ISSA PR 9(e). Compensation shall be consistent with ISSA PR Appendix 3.
- 7.3 Ring dings not secured or properly checked and knots coming untied will not be considered grounds for redress.

8. PROTESTS:

- 8.1 Protests procedure will be in accordance with ISSA PR Part VI
- 8.2 Protest forms will be available at one of the SSA Hoists by the rotation basin.
- 8.3 Video, data and/or photographs taken from any source shall not be presented by the competitors as evidence at protest hearings. This changes RRS 63.6.
- 8.4 The Protest Committee will hear protests at the end of racing each day at AYC.

9. SCORING:

- 9.1 Scoring will be in accordance with ISSA PR 9.

10. SAFETY:

- 10.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee either before leaving the course, or if that is impossible, immediately after arriving ashore.
