Bus Parking & Event Notes

Parking at MIT Sailing Pavilion

- There is **no parking directly in front of the pavilion**.
- Coaches may **drop sailors off first**, then go park.
- Sometimes there are meter spots available **across the street**.
- Meter parking usually requires a **parking/pay app**.
- There are several **parking garages within walking distance** a few blocks away.
- Plan extra time for parking and walking back to the pavilion.

Bus & Van Reminder – Storrow Drive

- **DO NOT take oversized buses/trucks on Storrow Drive**.
- Check your vehicle's **air draft/height restrictions** before traveling.
- Avoid becoming one of the vehicles stuck under a bridge on the news.

MIT Pavilion Event Reminders

- Teams should plan arrival times and building access accordingly.
- Please help **monitor trash throughout the day** and assist with overflowing trash bins.
- This is a **large 3-division event with 2 fleets**, so space will be tight.
- Bathrooms may back up by Saturday afternoon due to the number of people onsite.
- Additional bathrooms are available **across the street in the Walker Memorial Building**.
- Coaches should remind sailors where alternate bathrooms are located.

Gear Storage

- MIT's recreational sailing program will also be operating during the event.
- **Do not store bags or gear in the boat bays**.
- Teams should store gear bags on either **roof deck**.

Event Staffing

- Dan Tucker will be onsite during the weekend.
- Teams should still plan to have enough adults/coaches available to assist as needed.

Food Options

- There are several **good pizza places nearby** for team meals or delivery.
- Ordering ahead is recommended for large groups.
