### **WELCOME STATEMENT:**

Welcome to all Support Persons, Competitors, and Spectators. On behalf of Davis Island Youth Sailing Foundation, Davis Island Yacht Club, HB Plant High School, and all of our incredible volunteers, we would like to sincerely thank you for participating in today's event. This event would not be possible without the immense generosity of the Members of the Davis Island Yacht Club in opening access to their House and Grounds to all here today. As guests of their club, we kindly ask everyone to adhere to the following House and Grounds Rules.

All regatta management personnel have the authority to enforce these rules. Failure to follow the directives of regatta management personnel may be grounds for protest by the Race Committee and may be subject to Discretionary Penalties.

### **Parking, Unloading, Rigging:**

All vehicles, including road trailers, associated with any competing team, including vehicles driven by Support Persons, Competitors, and Spectators, without a current DIYC sticker, may NOT transit or be present west of the Speed Bump on Severn Ave on DIYC grounds at ANY time during the event.

All arriving vehicles must park, unload, and rig boats in the Rigging Area on the grass EAST of the Speed Bump. Boats may transit west of the speed bump enroute to the Work Area on their dollies ONLY. Use Caution and please yield to all DIYC member traffic, including cars, golf carts, and pedestrians.

Regatta management personnel will be present in the Rigging Area to assist with U-turns, reversing, and staging of vehicles and trailers. Golf cart shuttles will be available to teams and run the length of the DIYC property on Severn Ave. throughout the day.

### **Observation Deck & Dining Room:**

No personnel associated with any competing team, including Support Persons, Competitors, and Spectators, may be present on or transit through the Observation Deck during the event.

The Observation Deck is defined by the wooden surface on the 2nd floor of the clubhouse at DIYC.

Support Persons, Competitors, and Spectators MAY transit through, but not loiter in or upon, the elevator, stairwells, concrete landing pads, and wooden surfaces immediately adjacent to the entry doors when en route to the 2nd floor restaurant and dining room ONLY. You may not observe races, rest sailors, or coach from ANY of these areas. Please yield to all Member traffic at all times.

Support Persons, Competitors, and Spectators MAY utilize the restaurant and dining room for ONLY ordering and eating food. No personnel associated with any team may loiter for extended periods in the dining room for purposes of resting sailors, coaching, or observing races through the windows. The 2nd-floor bathrooms are OFF-LIMITS to all non-members.

### **Trash, Tents, Bathrooms, and Environmental Responsibility:**

We kindly ask that all Support Persons, Competitors, and Spectators take personal accountability for disposing of their trash in the provided trash bins. This includes bussing of your own dining room tables, bussing and cleaning of the picnic tables and bar area on the 1st floor, the pool area, the pool area bathrooms, the rigging area, parking lots, the work area, and the boat swap area on Point Beach.

Team tents may be set on the grass and along the seawall on the south side of the clubhouse and out towards the scoring stand, but not over the fire pit. Please ensure that your tent will not blow away and can be secured quickly in the event of a sudden storm or strong winds.

Please monitor the footprint your team makes on the property and routinely patrol the areas near your coolers, tents, equipment bags, boats, and staging areas to ensure a clean, neat, and tidy appearance at all times while competing in the event. Changing of clothes should occur only in bathrooms and out of the public eye.

Competitors are reminded that the Basic Principles in the RRS include Environmental Responsibility, and that all participants are encouraged to minimize any adverse environmental impact.
